WHEREAS, The Town Board of the Town of Bennington recognizes that this local law is a Type II Action under SEQR, and therefore a SEQR review will not be required as there are no adverse environmental impacts; and

NOW, on a Motion by No Motion, which has been duly Seconded by No Second,

BE IT RESOLVED, By the Town Board of the Town of Bennington, that it feels it is in the best interests of the Town to adopt a proposed Local Law entitled "A Local Law to Extend the Temporary Moratorium on Wind Energy Systems in the Town of Bennington."
